Be prepared for any kind of weather, especially at this time of year. Bring all the gear needed to keep you and your dog comfortable in any conditions. Bring all necessary dog training supplies: Crate, Training collars, Leash, Water, Pick up Bags etc.

Agree to Training Day Rules

ROCKY MOUNTAIN NAVHDA TRAINING DAY RULES

- 1. Be kind and courteous to all other handlers. Share the grounds and keep your training times reasonable so other people can work their dogs as well.
- 2. Be respectful of other dogs. Training days are meant for working your dog on hunting skills. These facilities are not a dog park. Please be courteous of dogs patiently waiting on chain gangs as they are still working. Do not allow your dog to meet other dogs without the handlers' permission.
- 3. You are responsible for all of your trash. Trash does not belong in the porta-potty but disposed of properly when you get home.
- 4. Your birds are your responsibility all day. From the moment you collect them at the beginning of the day. You must take home all birds that you purchased whether dead or alive at the end of the training day.
- 5. Clean up after your dog.
- 6. Training days begin when you drive on the facility and end when you leave. All rules must be followed the entire day.
- 7. All dogs must be on a leash at all times, unless they are actively working on a training component that requires them to be off lead.
- 8. If you sign up for a training day that has limited signups and are a no show, your registration will be restricted for other training days.
- 9. All handlers and guests must be RMC chapter, NAVHDA International current members and have a current Colorado Small Game or Fishing License.
- 10. Hunters orange must be worn in all live fire fields. Only designated gunners are permitted to shoot live ammo in the upland fields. No exceptions.
- 11. Dogs must be current on all vaccinations.
- 12. Take necessary safety precautions (ie. Sunscreen, bug spray etc.) Watch for ticks. There are rattlesnakes and bull snakes on the property so please monitor your surroundings.

Feb 12, 2021 Obedience Session – Place and Patience Building

Focus: Our focus will be teaching dogs the concept of place. We will discuss why this task is important for a dog to learn. We will utilize dogs of various ages and experience to demonstrate how to develop this progression along with ways to use this task further on in your dog's career. We will also focus on some patience building exercises both for puppies and older dogs prepping for steady and honor at the blind. We use place for our e-collar conditioning, so plan to attend this session if you would like to prepare for e-collar conditioning in a few weeks.

Dog Pre-Requisites: None. Dogs of all ages and skill sets welcome.

Tools Needed: High Value Treats, Leash, Check Cord

Feb 19, 2021 Obedience Session – Heels and Recalls

Focus: Our primary goal of the evening will be on developing a dog that heels due to their focus on the handler's body position. The progression will begin with developing "look" and then molding that into focused attention while on heel. We will also break down recalls to develop 100% consistency in distracting environments without the need for extra training aids.

Dog Pre-Requisites: None. Dogs of all ages and skill sets welcome.

Tools Needed: High Value Treats, Leash, Check Cord

Feb 26, 2021 Obedience Session – E-Collar Conditioning

Focus: This session will be building off of the Place and Patience Building work that handlers have been doing. We will utilize the Place command to begin overlaying e-collar stimulation. The goal of this session is for dogs to understand how to turn off pressure by completing a task. We will also discuss how to build a reward-based mindset in your dog to where they seek out the right answer by providing increasingly better work to yield maximum performance.

Dog Pre-Requisites: Place and Patience Building. Dogs chosen to participate in this session will be based on their understanding of the pre-requisite session as well as demonstrating the mental maturity desired to begin the e-collar conditioning process.

Tools Needed: High Value Treats, Leash, Check Cord, E-Collar

Mar 12, 2021 Steadiness Session 1 – Table Work

Focus: This 5-session series is designed for dogs that are ready to build their steadiness foundation. This first session will be focused on developing an understanding of the Whoa command on the table. This Series does require handlers to accomplish progression yardwork tasks to be prepared for the next session.

Dog Pre-Requisites: Recommendation is for dogs that have had at least one hunting season. E-Collar Conditioning is recommended before starting the steadiness progression.

Tools Needed: Leash, E-Collar

Mar 19, 2021 Puppy Pointing

Focus: Our goal is to expose puppies to scent of game and help develop the pointing instinct with the use of launchers and pigeons. The number of puppies in attendance will determine how much time can be spent with each puppy. We hope to provide insight into the development of each puppy and recommendations on how to proceed in exposing each young dog to birds to develop their scenting instincts.

Dog Pre-Requisites: Puppies should have had a bird intro prior to this session

Tools Needed: Leash, Water Bottle

Mar 26, 2021 Puppy Gun Introductions

Focus: Our goal is to introduce puppies to gunfire in a safe and engaging fashion. We will utilize the foundation that we introduce puppies to in the pointing session as a platform to create the situation desired to start our gun introductions. We will also discuss the progression to fully introduce the gun and how to work through increasing intensity, decreasing distance and how to add in successions of shots.

Dog Pre-Requisites: Puppies should have had a bird intro and also been a part of the Puppy Pointing Session.

Tools Needed: Leash, Water Bottle

April 9, 2021 Steadiness Session 2 – Table Work with Birds

Focus: This 5-session series is designed for dogs that are ready to build their steadiness foundation. This second session will be focused on further understanding of the whoa command in the presence of birds on the table. This Series does require handlers to accomplish progression yardwork tasks to be prepared for the next session.

Dog Pre-Requisites: Dogs should have spent time working on the tasks outlined in Session 1 and showing proficiency of the Whoa command.

Tools Needed: Leash, E-Collar

April 23, 2021 Steadiness Session 3 – Stop to Flush in the Field

Focus: This 5-session series is designed for dogs that are ready to build their steadiness foundation. This third session will be focused on further understanding of the whoa command in the presence of birds in the field. We will be outlining the progression of how to effectively develop a stop to flush that can be utilized not only in developing field steadiness but also as the pre-requisite to easily teaching the task of backing another dog for higher level testing. This Series does require handlers to accomplish progression yardwork tasks to be prepared for the next session.

Dog Pre-Requisites: Dogs should have spent time working on the tasks outlined in Session 2 and showing proficiency of the Whoa command.

Tools Needed: Leash, E-Collar, Water Bottle

May 7, 2021 Puppy Natural Ability Pre-Test Troubleshooting

Focus: Our focus for this evening will be providing handler tips to prepare for the Natural Ability test. Please designate which area you would like to work most on and any comments associated with that task. This information will help steer the focus of the training night but we will try to incorporate all components of the Natural Ability test. Not all puppies will get worked on all components so please put thoughtful consideration into the area your puppy needs to focus on most!

Dog Pre-Requisites: Handler should have read the AIMS Rules Book regarding the Natural Ability test to have introductory understanding of the test requirements.

Tools Needed: Leash, Water Bottle, Check Cord, Whistle

May 21, 2021 Steadiness Session 4 – Field Work Pigeons in Launchers

Focus: This 5-session series is designed for dogs that are ready to build their steadiness foundation. This fourth session will be utilizing the Whoa Foundation and the dogs understanding of Stop to Flush to start putting these concepts to work with pigeons in the field. We will be working dogs through bird contacts and focus on the dog staying steady through the fall of the bird. We will be shooting blanks for the dog so all dogs present should have had a proper gun introduction. This Series does require handlers to accomplish progression yardwork tasks to be prepared for the next session.

Dog Pre-Requisites: Dogs should have spent time working on the tasks outlined in Session 2 and 3 and showing proficiency of the Whoa command.

Tools Needed: Leash, E-Collar, Water Bottle

June 4, 2021 Steadiness Session 5 – Field Work on Chukar

Focus: This 5-session series is designed for dogs that are ready to build their steadiness foundation. This final session will be all the skills from the previous 4 sessions to put it all together and begin field work on chukar. We will be working dogs through bird contacts and focus on the dog staying steady through the fall of the bird. We will be shooting for the dog so all dogs present should have had a proper gun introduction. This Series does require handlers to accomplish progression yardwork tasks to be prepared for the next session.

Dog Pre-Requisites: Dogs should have spent time working on the tasks outlined in Session 4 and showing proficiency of all of the previously outlined work.

Tools Needed: Leash, E-Collar, Water Bottle

June 18, 2021 Puppy Pointing

Focus: Our goal is to expose puppies to scent of game and help develop the pointing instinct with the use of launchers and pigeons. The number of puppies in attendance will determine how much time can be spent with each puppy. We hope to provide insight into the development of each puppy and recommendations on how to proceed in exposing each young dog to birds to develop their scenting instincts.

Dog Pre-Requisites: Puppies should have had a bird intro prior to this session

Tools Needed: Leash, Water Bottle

July 9, 2021 Puppy Gun Introductions

August 13, 2021 Puppy Natural Ability Pre-Test Troubleshooting and Hunting Season Prep

Focus: Our focus for this evening will be providing handler tips to prepare for the Natural Ability test. Please designate which area you would like to work most on and any comments associated with that task. This information will help steer the focus of the training night but we will try to incorporate all components of the Natural Ability test. Not all puppies will get worked on all components so please put thoughtful consideration into the area your puppy needs to focus on most! For puppies that have already gone through their Natural Ability test, we will also be discussing Hunting Season Prep to give these young dogs the best opportunities on wild birds.

Dog Pre-Requisites: Handler should have read the AIMS Rules Book regarding the Natural Ability test to have introductory understanding of the test requirements.

Tools Needed: Leash, Water Bottle, Check Cord, Whistle
